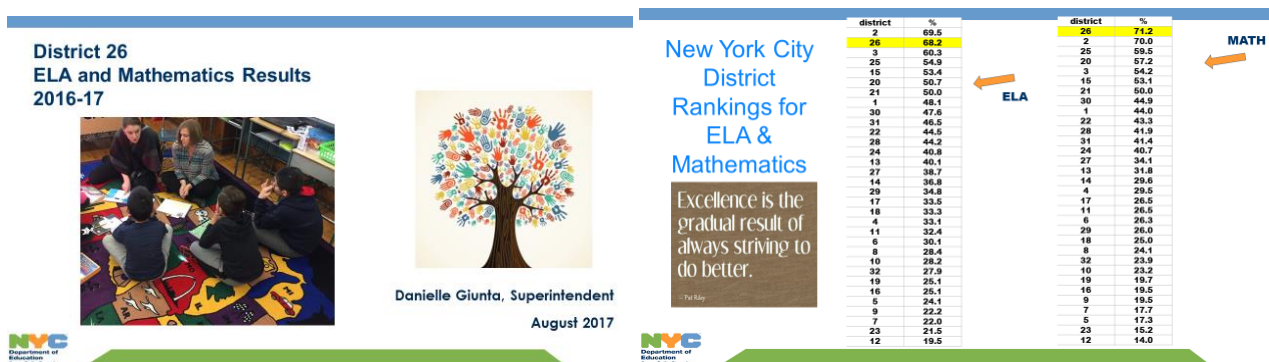

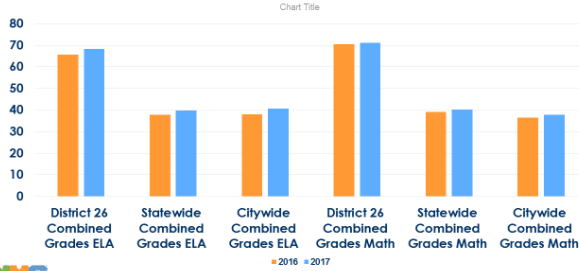

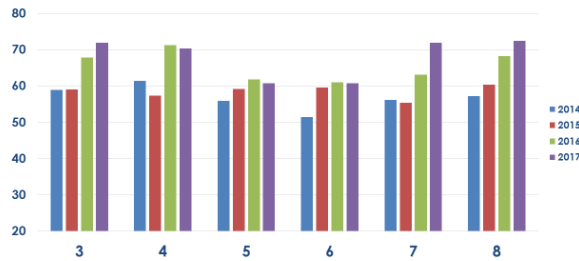

District ELA Proficiency By Grade

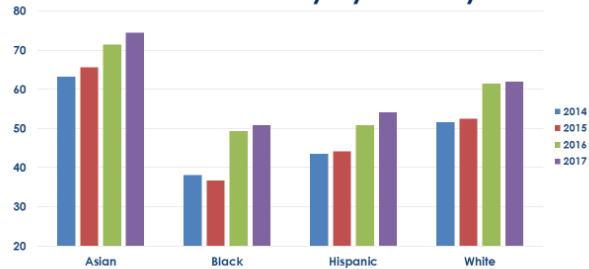

ELA Proficiency by Ethnicity

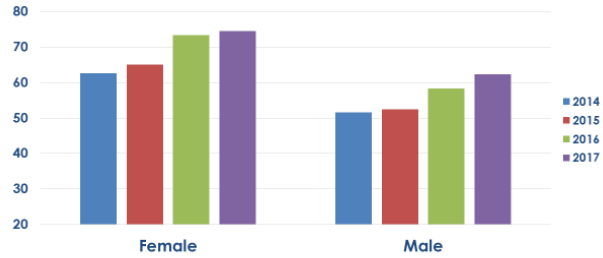

District 26 ELA Proficiency By Gender

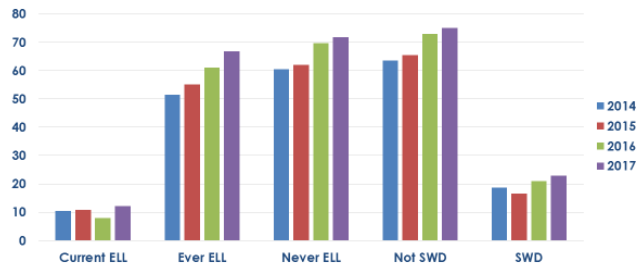


D26 ELA Gender Subgroup Results Compared to NYC and NYS

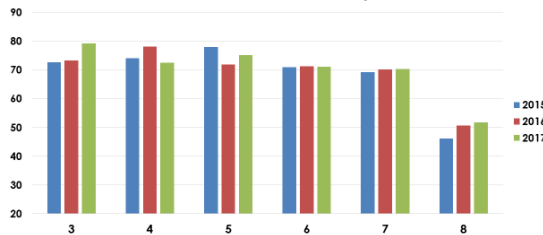

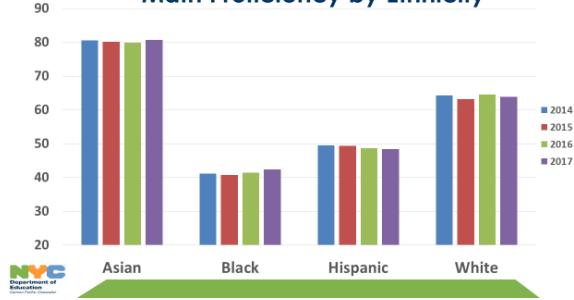

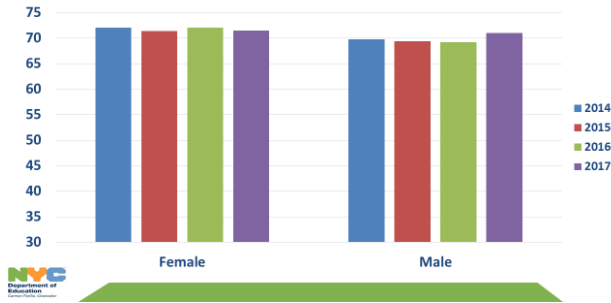
Math Proficiency by Ethnicity

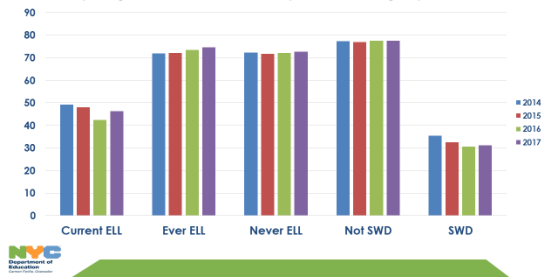
Mathematics Proficiency By Gender
