Alan welcomed John, Treasurer of President's Council, to the joint meeting between the CDEC and President's Council.

Albery Melo and Hallie Martin, presented on the rezoning plan for CDEC 26

- New building Q332, 210-07 48th Avenue
 - Anticipated 2017-18 school year
 - Will provide 468 elementary school students 3-4 sections per grade
- Guiding Policies and Principles:
 - Year of Implementation
 - o Impact on current students
 - Sibling Grandfathering decided by CDEC (generally approved)
 - o Admissions
 - Transportation/Busing more than .5 miles from student's address for kindergarten students;
- Methodology to determine Target Kindergarten Zone Site
 - Consults SCA "Blue Book" for seat capacity in each school impacted by new school
 - Look at surrounding schools (PS31(143%), PS203(157%), PS41(173%), PS159(129%), PS162(169%) ---- Currently there is a deficit of over 1,000
- Methodology to determine the Zone Lines
 - Based on recent public school enrollment trends
 - Will replot zone lines based on
 - new residential construction provided by SCA; community should let DOE know about these as well
 - diversity maintain the identity of surrounding schools & in creation of new school
 - geographic barriers ex. dangerous intersection, etc.
 - travel distance

- Timeline next steps
 - starting to conduct analyses
 - can work with CDEC on proposed scenario together or let DOE put proposal together and bring to CDEC committee
 - Spring 2016 is target for presentation of proposal to District 26 community
 - DEC then has 45 days to vote on it

**major goal is to alleviate overcrowding at PS41 - to remove portables.

Question: Was a traffic study done yet and will it be provided to CDEC? Yes. They will request it.

Superintendent's Report:

- Principal of Bayside H.S. explained that the proposed new high school directly across from Bayside H.S. was voted down by the community board.

- Leslie suggested that school liaisons call the parent coordinators of the schools they visit to find out about their needs for crossing guards.
- Mary suggested the CDEC members also ask if the crossing guards are at the school regularly.
- A discussion regarding whether or not the School Safety Pledge regarding proper drop off procedures should be sent out again this year.
- Michelle volunteered to develop a survey that encompasses all of the concerns mentioned to provide CDEC members in December.
- Michelle asked whether communities should be informed about potential rezoning impact. Danielle suggested that CDEC members should present to PTA meetings at schools involved. Leslie suggested that those members who have children in the affected districts can present at PTA meetings.
