PROPOSED NOVEMBER 2011 AMENDMENT – HIGHLIGHTS

Reaffirms need for 50,000 seats first identified in November 2010.

Capitalize on cost efficiencies by increasing seats for two projects in areas of need:

- > PS 343M (Peck Slip): 476 seats increased to 656 seats
- > PS/IS 314Q: 757 seats increased to 833 seats

Shift \$200 million in Technology from FY 2012 to FY 2013 and FY2014. (\$100 million each year)

1. Minutes

Jeannette asked the council had they had an opportunity to read/review the November 22nd minutes. Vijay made a motion to accept the November 22nd minutes and Ms. Kapur seconded. Council agreed unanimously to accept the minutes.

2. President's Report – Jeannette Segal

A. Attended Queens Borough President meeting where Jesse Mojica was present and outlined how he became involved with the schools and he feels that there will be more communication between the DOE and parents. Jesse outlined about parent involvement and asked attendees (approx 30) individually if they had any questions:

1. Jeannette asked about the difficulty of middle schools and asked about the tool kits that were given to principals. Susan Shiroma was also in attendance.

2. Transportation -Students have not received waivers

3. Budget – Common core – how were they going to pay for the training of the teachers, parents and students? Where was the money coming from? As of now schools do not have art or gym teachers. (No answer)

4. Questions asked – what do you think is the role of the CDEC? (No answer)

5. How are IEP children coming into kindergarten and going to general education instead of special education? How are children being evaluated and what is the process?

B. Jesse stated that his position has been elevated to part of the Chancellor's cabinet and states that now he has a vote and hopefully there will be a better communication/response process to the CDEC's issues.

3. Budget

Books purchased for members of the CDEC and President's Council (Beyond the Bake Sale-The Essential Guide to Family –School Partnership).

Ariel Guerrero (CDEC liaison) spoke about the partnership not being forced on anyone (16 pilot schools). Will be sending the organizational chart to the CDEC.

4. Old Business

Jeannette informed the attendees that the representative from the UFT (Mr. Kazansky) who was to present on bullying at the November meeting (due to bad weather) will be rescheduled for the January 26th meeting.

5. New Business

Susan outlined the meeting with Mr. Mulgrew who spoke about the UFT taking teachers out to Cincinnati to review their model setup.

Common Core curriculum has not been developed as of yet.

Jeannette questioned the RFP (how is it being developed and by whom)? Ariel will look into it.

Mary Vaccaro stated that Lobby Day is March 21st to Albany.

Ricky & Lucy attended the Parent training on the Progress Report (copies will be made and distributed for the next meeting). Would like to make it more user friendly.

Ms. Kapur trying to set up a school visit with PS 133.

Jeannette spoke Susan Shiroma' position. Susan stated that she does not have the time to input information to the minutes.

Mary Vaccaro informed the attendees that a crossing guard was taken away from the corner of Union Tpke & Commonwealth. Ariel will look into it.

Lori informed the attendees that there was a student (Meghan Dinegar) from Cardozo sitting in on the meeting and hopefully will be joining the CDEC once approved.
